CHEMISTRY ON THE MOVE

Starting immediately, opportunities for undergraduate students with a BS major in Chemistry or Biochemistry exist to earn a Dual Bachelor degree from a European and US University. Full fellowships for a transatlantic study year are available.

With the support of the European Union and the US-Department of Education in the ATLANTIS program, a Dual Bachelor Degree Program is being established between

Students, who successfully complete the program and write an Honors thesis on research being jointly supervised at one of the European and at one US institutions mentioned above, will be eligible for a Dual, Transatlantic BS Degree: one from the University of Kansas or Arkansas, the second from the University of Regensburg or Dublin City University.

European students will spend one semester at any European University, e.g. as part of an Erasmus exchange program, and subsequently one year from the beginning of September until late August at either Kansas University or University of Arkansas.

US-Students will spend the fall semester at Dublin City University (Dublin, Ireland), from mid-September until late January; then transfer to the University of Regensburg (Regensburg, Germany) for a 6-week intensive course in German, from early March through mid-April, followed by the summer semester in Regensburg, which runs from mid-April through late July.



Program Summary

- Open to all undergraduate students with a Bachelor of Science major in Chemistry of Biochemistry.
- 4-year curriculum including a transatlantic stay of one year, preferably in the third year of study.
- Degree Awarded: Dual Bachelor Degree between one European and one US institution of the participating partners.
- Fellowships are available: 12000 EUR/yr (European students) or 12000 USD/yr (US students)

Deadline for application is **March 1, 2008** to start the transatlantic stay in the following fall. However, interested **students are strongly encouraged to contact the program coordinators of their schools early (preferably at the beginning of their second year)** to give ample time for language and cultural preparation and in order to meet special course requirements for the Dual Bachelor degree.
